Police Action

Police raided two brothels on Zinzan Street and found 11 women. Insp Keith Stacey, from the local neighbourhood policing team, said: "These warrants are the result of an intelligence-led policing operation. The intelligence included information received from members of the public."

So, if you see anything suspicious it's well worth reporting it to 101 (or 999 if appropriate). Note

that if it's reported as drug dealing / prostitution / etc., it appears in the crime figures and counts. If it's just described as "suspicious activity" it won't show up.

Thanks to donations and help from the Oasis, Carey Centre, Tescos, Horse and Jockey, Lifespring Church and everyone who brought food or just came along.

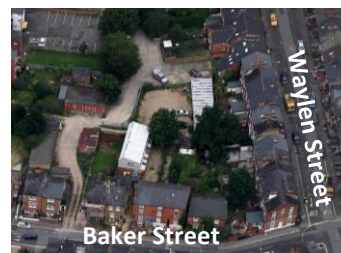
Survey Results

Thanks to everyone who filled in a survey – we had a great response.

We asked you to identify your main concerns in the local area. Having collated all the returns, the top thing you raised with us was bins on pavements (62% raised this), bins overfilled (55%), and then drugs, street drinking and dogs fouling (all 52%).

As a result of this we know what you want us to prioritise and we are already on the case!

Land to the rear of 14 - 24 Baker Street and rear of 34 - 42 Waylen Street:

Conversion of NHS clinic into one 2-bed house with garden, and demolition of existing office block, followed by erection of a new 2-storey office block. (area shown on left)
