WE'VE INCREASED THE RANGE OF ITEMS THAT GO IN YOUR RECYCLING BIN



CLEAR PLASTIC FOOD TRAYS like those used for cakes, meat or punnet containers



ICE CREAM AND MARGARINE TUBS



YOGHURT CREAM SOUP AND SNACK POTS



CARTONS such as milk, soup or juice



COSMETICS POTS AND TUBS





CLEAN FOIL AND FOIL TRAYS such as those from takeaways



PLASTIC BOTTLES e.g. for milk, mineral water, lemonade, shampoo, fabric conditioner





TINS, CANS AND AEROSOLS e.g. soup and beans tins, dunks coms, deodorants, air fresheners



PAPER e.g. newspaper, magazines, flyers, junk mail



CARDBOARD e.g. card food packaging, toilet paper inner cardboard, packaging

Please rinse out all non-paper and card items. Squash them to give you more room in your recycling. Place all items loose in your bin. Do not put them in plastic bag.


# Clean up our neighbourhood READING RESCUE RESCUE Friday 2 & Saturday 3 March


#### **Games & Chat Nights**
